We are writing to you because the court has approved your request to be a member of both settlement classes in the case known as *Berry v. LexisNexis Risk & Information Analytics Group, Inc.* The *Berry* lawsuit was filed in 2011. It asserted claims regarding the handling and treatment of “Accurint” reports sold by defendant LexisNexis. A settlement of the *Berry* lawsuit was approved by the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia approved the settlement on September 5, 2014. After review in an appellate court, the settlement became final in October, 2016.

The court approved settlements for two different classes of people. One class was all people about whom defendant had information in its database in a specific period of time (the “Rule 23(b)(2) Class”). To settle the case with the first class, LexisNexis changed the contents of some of its reports, and made other business practice changes. Members of the first class received no money and gave up only claims for statutory and punitive damages. You are already a member of this class and no further action by you is required or permitted.

The other class consisted of people who, before April 29, 2013, either asked defendant for a copy of the Accurint report about them, or contacted defendant and claimed that something in their Accurint report was wrong (the “Rule 23(b)(3) Class”). To settle the case with the second class, LexisNexis agreed to put up a fund of money to be divided among the class members. The payment per class member is \$336.36. Any member of the second class who accepts that payment releases any claims for actual damages with respect to events involving Accurint reports which occurred before October 28, 2016.

LexisNexis’s records showed that you were not a member of the second class as it was originally defined in the settlement agreement. However, you contacted Rust Consulting, the settlement administrator for the *Berry* settlement, and told Rust that you believed you should have been paid money because of something LexisNexis did with information about you. Other people contacted Rust and made similar claims. The lawyers for the class and for the defendant discussed the matter, and agreed to modify the settlement to make those persons who contacted Rust to ask for money members of the second class—the Rule 23(b)(3) Class—so that they could receive a cash payment in exchange for a release. The parties submitted that agreement to the district court, and the court on January 3, 2017 approved it.

Here are your options as a new member of the Rule 23(b)(3) Class:

DO NOTHING	You will receive a check in the amount of \$336.36. You give up all claims for actual damages against LexisNexis relating to any Fair Credit Reporting Act violations or violations of similar state laws prior to October 28, 2016. EXCLUDE YOURSELF	You will get no payment. This is the only option that allows you to be part of any other lawsuit against LexisNexis that seeks actual damages for the legal claims in this case.

To exclude yourself from the Rule 23(b)(3) Class, you must send a letter that says you want to be excluded. Be sure to include the name of the lawsuit (*Berry v. LexisNexis*), your name, mailing address, telephone number and signature. You must mail your exclusion request **postmarked no later than April 24, 2017** to: LexisNexis Settlement Exclusions, Notice Administrator, P.O. Box 2983, Faribault MN 55021.

If we do not hear from you by April 24, 2017, you will be included in the settlement and we will process and mail you a settlement check in the amount of \$336.36.
